The MSU-Coastal Research and Extension Center MarketMaker Team partnered with Alabama MarketMaker and had an exhibit as well as a poster presentation at the 2012 Bays and Bayous Symposium last week, November 14-15 at the Mississippi Gulf Coast Coliseum.

Historically, each symposium has drawn scientists, students, businesses, educators, non-governmental organizations and concerned citizens. The Bays and Bayous Symposium began in 1979 and was titled Alabama's Bays, Bayous and Beaches Symposium. It was held again in 1987, widening the scope of the 1979 event to include the economic importance of coastal waters, educational programs and habitat restoration. In 1995, the symposium continued to focus on science while expanding its audience to include local industry and government. In 2006, it was decided that the meeting would be held every two years, rotating between Alabama and Mississippi.
